


From becoming a running lion to conducting senior research, the opportunities to share, and grow withing the community provided substance at Saint Leo.

There were no final goodbyes nor last days spent with friends before parting ways into the next phases of adulthood.


For parents, it was especially heartbreaking to not see their children live out their

all of the hard work you put into getting


It is Okay to not Land Your **Dream Job Right Away**


Stay Connected with your Friends, and Thank Faculty and Staff who have Helped You.

Employers listed on Handshake have requested students with the specific skills, majors, and experiences that Saint Leo students already have or are currently learning and developing.


However, Handshake and Career Services offer far more than simply a platform for Saint Leo students to connect with the professional workforce.



COVID-19 pandemic will need to be extremely patient.

"In a slow and uncertain job market, it's going to take you some time to find the right opportunity," says Mickey. "The process is just going to take longer."

With that in mind, planning ahead becomes crucial for graduates. Mickey suggests that job-seeking students should pause to tackle their immediate goals first, rather than focusing exclusively on their long-term

In other words, it is important for graduates to work on developing and pursuing a temporary "Plan B" until "Plan A" becomes viable.

"It's a job to get a job," says Mickey. "You have to be very active in the process." She recommends students construct a personalized task list and set aside a few hours every day or every other day to dedicate towards searching for jobs and applying for positions. It is also vital for graduates to spend ample time constructing their

According to a study conducted by the National Association of Colleges and Employers, nearly 80% of employers use one or more forms of social media as aids in the employee recruitment process, with a little over 45% using various online sources to identify potential candidates. LinkedIn was singled out as the most popular among employers, having been used by over 90% of employers.

Handshake, a platform similar to LinkedIn, is already available and easily accessible for current Saint Leo students and alumni via their Okta login portal.

The jobs and internships

listed on Handshake are listed by employers who are specifically looking for Saint Leo students, making this an invaluable jobsearching resource for graduates.

However, more than anything, students need to remember that they are not alone. College graduates across the nation and throughout the world are facing the same challenging future.

And the employees, faculty, and staff here at Saint Leo University are still ready to help their students rise to the challenge.

"We're here for you when you need us, no matter where you are in the process," says Mickey.

One day as I was watching them walk down the hallway to class, the secretary said I should consider becoming a substitute. I told her that I didn't have a college degree. She told me

that our district was in such need for substitutes, that all I needed was a high school diploma. So, I became a substitute at Citrus County Schools. Eventually, I figured out that my mother was right all along. I wanted to be a teacher! And I actually LOVE kids! Sorry, mom, I guess I should have listened to you all of those years ago!

In January 2016, everything changed. After several years with his employer, my husband was let go. With my work as a substitute and some assistance from unemployment, we made it through the months it took him to find a new and better job. That summer, I decided to enroll at Saint Leo to pursue my Bachelor's in Elementary Education. As a busy wife and mother to twin boys who worked full-time substituting at their school, I needed the flexibility that Saint Leo's online classes me.

So that Fall, I worked on my classes while balancing working full-time as a substitute teacher, caring for my children, husband, and pets as well as working part-time as a freelance photographer. My hard work paid off in 2018, and I earned my Associate of Arts degree. I even walked in the Gainesville commencement ceremony to celebrate my achievement!

While pursuing my AA, I took two amazing history classes, and it was those two classes that made me realize I wanted to be a history teacher! I changed my major, and with that, my residence. I became an Adult Education student at the main campus! I was so excited to be able to attend classes at the campus as I never thought I would be a real college student! I'll be honest, there were a few times that I was mistaken for a member of Faculty, but that was ok. I just told them I was an "alternative aged student." I made several friends at the campus and even felt welcomed by the "kids" in my classes. I tried to help them as much as I could and be a support to them when they needed me.

I have taken the test two additional times and still have not passed it. But I wouldn't let that stop me from reaching my goal! I changed my degree to Educational Studies:

Education and Adolescence- Social Sciences determined to finish what I started! I switched back to the online platform and took my last four classes online, returning to where I started. Through all of the ups and downs, the stress and the heartache, I never gave up.

And that is the message I want to impart to you today. No matter what life hands you, never give up. No matter how hard it might seem, you can do anything you set your mind to accomplish. Every morning you have two choices: Continue to sleep with your dreams or wake up and chase them. Because as Eleanor Roosevelt eloquently said, "The future belongs

to those who believe in the beauty of their dreams." Thank you to my husband Corey, my sons Dominic & Damien, and our families for supporting me in the many ways you have through this process. I love you all more than I can ever say.

Thank you to my Professors, University Supervisors, Cooperating Teachers, and classmates for all of your guidance and support. And finally, congratulations to my fellow Graduates...I wish you all the best of luck as you follow your dreams and remember, all our dreams can come true, if we have the courage to pursue them.
