Commencement Speaker

The 38th Governor of the State of Florida, Bob Graham, will address the 395 member Class of 1985 at Saint Leo College during the Commencement Exercises being held on Saturday, April 27, at 3 p.m. in the Marion Bowman Activities Center on campus.

A native Floridian, Governor Graham is currently in his second term and has distinguished himself through his pursuit for higher academic standards in the state, the restriction of growth of our state, while still providing economic development for job opportunities and his leadership in facilitating landmark environmental laws with more efficient environmental regulation.

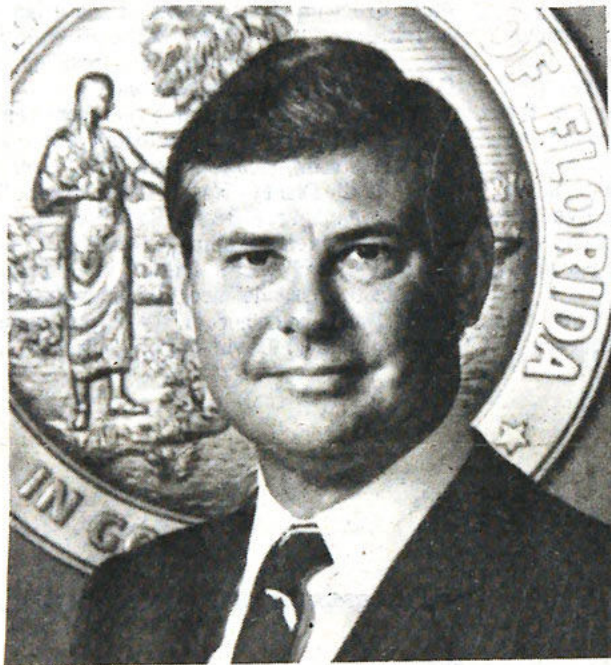
Governor Graham received a Bachelor's degree from the University of Florida in 1959 and a Law degree from Harvard Law School in 1962.

Saint Leo College President Dr. Thomas B. Southard, will confer an Honorary Doctor of Humanities upon Governor Graham during the Commencement Exercises.

Earlier in the day the Baccalaureate Homily was delivered by the Most Rev. John J. Snyder, D.D., Bishop of Saint Augustine.

A native of Manhattan, NY, he was installed as the eighth Bishop of Saint Augustine on December 5, 1979, and has "Peace in Christ" as the theme for his ministry.

Under his auspices, the first Office of Hispanic Affairs and first Office of Ministry with Disabled Persons were established in the St. Augustine Diocese, the latter of which was instrumental in the development of the first Catholic group home for mentally disabled in Jacksonville known as Harbour House, which was dedicated in March 1985. Also under his leadership, the first Faith in Sharing Retreat was created, as was the first full-time position for a communications director within the diocese.

Nationally, he is a member of the Catholic Relief Services Commission and is a consultant to the National Conference of Catholic Bishops Committee on the Liturgy for a three-year term.

Bishop Snyder will be conferred with an Honorary Doctor of Laws degree by President Southard during the Commencement Exercises.

The Commencement Week activities included a day long cruise by the Class of 1985

Following the Baccalaureate Mass Saturday morning, a buffet luncheon was held.

Governor Graham and Bishop Snyder were

guests of the Board of Trustees for a private luncheon, as well.

The official class photograph taken annually on the steps of Saint Leo Abbey Church is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. followed by the walk by the Class of 1985 from the Abbey Church to the Activities Center at 2:30 p.m.

Immediately following the Commencement Exercises, the Army ROTC Bar-Pinning Ceremony was held in the McDonald Student Center, Lions Lounge.

Restaurant Management Wrap-up

Asked to what he attributes the success of the Restaurant Management Program during the past academic school year, Harry Purchase, director of the program, answers, "People, people, people."

It is the people—namely, students who have inquisitive minds and an Advisory Council whose members care about Saint Leo College and about the education of young men and women in the hospitality field. Essentially, these two groups are responsible for spreading the glow of credibility and recognition over a carefully designed smorgasbord of academic classwork, guest lectures, field trips and social activities.

A remarkable number and variety of events were scheduled throughout the year. Such activities provide the students not only with a variety of experiences, but also with a means by which to compare, contrast and formulate judgments. And, very importantly, with each introduction to yet another aspect of the restaurant business, comes another opportunity for the students to sharpen their communication skills.

The highly successful first event—a "social symposium"—which was held on campus back in October, brought students together with guests from as near as the campus and as far as Washington, D.C. A lavish buffet featuring food specialties from Red Lobster, Casa Gallardo and Darryls restaurants—made all the more delectable by the music and entertainment of Rosey O'Grady's Good

Time Emporium—was relished by students and guests.

At a later date a gourmet dinner—your choice of entrees among such delights as veal piccata, shrimp scampi, tournedos roquefort, roasted duckling and sweetbreads, German style—was enjoyed at the Bon Appetit. In addition to the exceptional food prepared by the German chef, Bon Appetit boasts claim to the most extraordinary sunset on the sun coast. And for good reason: from the deck terrace one can literally reach out and touch the water. Owner Peter Kreuzinger hosted the group in a lecture and tour of the premises.

At intervals during the remainder of the year, tours and lectures were enjoyed at Church Street Station—the most popular nightclub in Florida; Walt Disney World—the number one tourist attraction in America today; Red Lobster restaurant and fishery in Pinellas County—an experience that should be mandatory for every restaurateur; Casa Gallardo's and Morrison's distribution centers and restaurants—a discovery of the importance of production and "behind the scenes" management.

A meeting, luncheon and beach party hosted by Russ Kimball at the five-star Sheraton Sand Key Resort last Saturday was the culminating even of the year's learning-experience program.

A lesson in support of "thinking as an optimist" was revealed through the sequence of

the day's weather pattern: Dawn pushed its way through wild and ominous clouds that morning and gentle rain fell as students boarded the bus at Saint Leo's. Nearly simultaneously upon their arrival at Sand Key, the sun burst through the clouds and remained throughout the day warming and delighting students and guests alike as they enjoyed good food, conversation and recreation.

"What a perfect place to end our year's activities, here at a plush resort located on one of the finest beaches on the Gulf," one student was overheard saying. "But," he continued, "our guests made the day. It is our guests who put the frosting on the cake."

The majority of guests who attended the various functions are also members of the Advisory Council to the Restaurant Management Program. Spearheader of the group's activities and "Godfather" of the program is Mr. A.M. (Tony) Franco, vice president of General Mills Restaurant Division.

Names of other supportive members read as if taken from a catalogue listing of VIP's: Jim Armstrong, vice president, Food Operations, Walt Disney World; Russ Kimball, general manager, Sheraton Sand Key Hotel; Dick Milano, general manager and Vice President of Church Street Station in Orlando; Luke Scott, personnel director of Morrison's; Peter Dorn, co-owner of the Copacobana, New York City; David Murphy, director of

College and recruiting, Marriott Corporation; Peter Kreuzinger, owner of Bon appetit and Jamaica Inn in Dunedin; Mike Lane, personnel director, Red Lobster and Joe Lawrence, former president of the American Hotel and Motel Association, is an honorary member.

The curriculum committee of Saint Leo College recently approved of two new courses which will be added to the Restaurant Management curriculum. Both courses, "Introduction to Restaurant Management" and "Internship in Restaurant Management" will be required of all entering students majoring in Restaurant Management. A third course in food fundamentals will be added at a future date. However, the present basic core requirements will not be altered. Emphasis shall continue to be placed in two areas of concentration: traditional liberal arts and business administration.

When questioned as the need of restaurant management majors studying philosophy, literature, music and the like, Purchase replied, "The hospitality executive, as any college graduate for that matter, should be well versed in both his own area of expertise and in the general area of "humanity", if you will. This is, in my opinion, a prerequisite to entering the "real" world where one tries to make the best living possible and live the best life possible. And, surely, it will help make possible your looking into the mirror twenty years hence liking what you see."
