Florida Senator Edgar M. Dunn, Jr. will address the 268 graduates at Saint Leo College's fourteenth annual Commencement Exercises scheduled at 4 p.m. on Sunday, April 20, in the Marion Bowman Activities Center.

Dunn was first elected to the Florida Senate in 1974 after completing two appointments as the Assistant State Attorney for the 7th Judicial Circuit and serving one year as the Assistant City Attorney and City Prosecutor for Daytona Beach.

The native Floridian received his Doctor of Jurisprudence

from the University of Florida Law Center and his Bachelor of Arts from the University of Florida. For two years he served as General Counsel to Governor Reubin O'D. Askew; served on the Governor's Council on Criminal Justice; was the Florida Delegate to the National Council on Criminal Justice Standards and Goals; was Chairman of the Organized Crime Coordinating Council.

He has received numerous professional and civic awards including the "Outstanding Legislative Contribution" award from the Florida

Academy of Trial Lawyers in 1976.

He and his wife, Margaret, reside in Daytona Beach with their four children.

The Most Reverend W. Thomas Larkin, D.D., Bishop of the Diocese of St. Petersburg, will deliver the Baccalaureate Homily at 10:30 a.m. the same day.

Bishop Larkin received his Doctorate in Sacred Theology from Rome's University of St. Thomas, where he was a classmate of Pope John Paul II and one of only three Americans in the graduating class.

His service to the Catholic Church since Ordination in 1947 has all been spent in Florida parishes, predominantly at Christ the King Parish in Jacksonville, which he founded, and St. Cecelia's Parish in Clearwater, in addition to his term as Officialis and Vicar General of the Diocese of St. Petersburg since its creation, prior to his election in 1979 as the second Bishop of that Diocese.

He served from 1975 until 1979 as a member of the Saint Leo College Board of Trustees and has a long-standing friendship with the nuns from

Holy Name Priory which began during his very first assignment as Associate Pastor at Holy Family Parish in North Miami, associated with Holy Family School which at that time was run by Holy Name Priory.

During Commencement Exercises Senator Dunn will receive an Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree from Saint Leo and Bishop Larkin will receive an Honorary Doctor of Laws degree.
