


One of the big problems here at Saint Leo is the condition of the dorms. If the school would pledge all the materials, I feel we could increase the community spirit by doing most of the work ourselves and I will personally do my share.

Another area of concern is the financial problem, not the college's, but the students'. Many students can't buy what they

want because of the high prices. If elected, I would work towards the implementation of a student Consumer Union which, through local merchants, would give students a percentage off most purchases.

An area where many students do not participate is the rip off areas. Many students get ripped off here and I feel SGA could do something about it. The SGA could set up a Personal Property Insurance program in which a student would pay \$3 - \$5 yearly and get protection for all personal items.






