Progress of the Activities Center

In the past month or so, a rumor has had it that the new activities center will be completed by next fall. Yesterday Dean Kaye showed me the basis for such a story.

The Board of Directors in their Feb. meeting gave its approval to compile the architectural drawings of the proposed center. Dean Kaye has been working with architect George R. Tebrugge on getting the basic ideas on paper and in a meeting this coming Monday, the work on exact details of the buildings will begin.

If the plans are approved by the Board in their May meeting, college money to the extent of \$800,000 plus government money will be made available. Following the approval, the college will then accept bids concerning construction cost. The architect Mr. Tebrugge said that he can have the main structure completed by December.

In the pictures of the building there are four different sections: the domed auditorium, the pool area, the locker room section, and finally the students sports center. The sections that will be constructed by December.

are the pool, locker room section, and the main part of the building: the students sports center. Provisions will be made in the building structure for when the school is ready to add the domed section.

The structure will be located on the south section of the track with the sports section measuring 235 feet by 112 feet. Some of the facilities which will be contained in the new buildings are: five outdoor lighted hand ball courts; indoor rifle range, six to nine bowling allies, three basketball courts and bleachers for the seating of 4,000 people, training rooms, sauna bath, womens dance studio, mens weight lifting room, general equipment room, heated outdoor pool, two classrooms, a projection room, movie screen, portable staging and accustics for concerts. These are just some of the proposed facilities.

Dean Kaye is the man behind the scenes on this project. He feels "This will be a tremendous asset to our college. We are hoping to play our first basketball game in it next year."

LATE SEPTEMBER WORD ON ROTC

Saint Leo College has formally applied for a U. S. Army Reserve Officer Training Corps program which, if approved by the Department of the Army, would begin training on the campus in September, 1969.

Colonel Gibson R. Finley, deputy chief of staff for ROTC at U. S. Third Army headquarters, Atlanta, Ga., said that the Army is beginning 30 new ROTC detachments throughout

the United States in 1968 and 1969.

The colonel said that a decision on Saint Leo College's application would probably be made by late September or early October, 1968.

"It would be possible for a student here to substitute ROTC training for physical education, and by exercise of additional electives to qualify for a bachelor of arts degree with a course concentration in military

science." Father Stephen said.

Lt. Col. James W. Carroll, with Third Army Headquarters, paid an all day visit to Saint Leo College to examine facilities for developing an ROTC program. Col. Carroll said that if the college's application is approved, a professor of military science and a non-commissioned officer would be selected and assigned to the college next January. The two would

begin immediately to organize a training program compatible with the college curriculum.

By June 1969, the full complement of four officers and four non-commissioned officers would be assigned to the college as an ROTC detachment. Next spring and summer would be devoted to getting requisite supplies, uniforms, text books, and the setting up of administrative offices. Military science courses would be offered beginning with the fall 1969 trimester.

The U. S. Army currently offers approximately 1000 full scholarships annually to selected students taking ROTC programs in colleges and universities. ROTC cadets are also paid \$50 monthly in junior and senior years, in addition to receiving active duty pay for six weeks training on Army posts during the summer months, Col. Carroll said.

Father Stephen said that he had hoped to begin an ROTC program in September 1968, which would have made currently enrolled freshmen and sophomores eligible for the training.

Minimum training requirements for ROTC are for the junior and senior years; therefore today's freshmen will be the only Saint Leo College students with sufficient time remaining to complete the two-year minimum training.

A student who successfully completes ROTC training, and is awarded a baccalaureate degree, is awarded a U. S. Army Reserve second lieutenant's commission.

SPOTLIGHT --- IRISH

St. Patrick, the 15th century apostle to Ireland, is commonly given credit for the conversion of the Irish to Christianity. The date of his death, March 17, 461, is a national holiday in Ireland, but should it be?

Born about 385, the son of Calpornius, a Roman deacon, and his Celtic

wife somewhere in what is believed to be Wales, the Irish Patron Saint had a normal childhood until age 16. At the age of 16, he was captured by Irish raiders and sold into slavery. After many years of being a slave, he and a few others escaped and sailed to what was then Gaul, thinking it was Britian. He then wan-

dered around, finally ending up at home in Wales. All the time he was wandering, he kept thinking of those poor pagan Irish. So, out of the goodness of his Italian heart, he studied for the priesthood and applied for a mission to Ireland. The Pope almost gave it to him, but another bishop related a sin of his youth to the

Pope and another was sent instead, That's right, St. Patrick was the second missionary from Rome to go to Ireland. It wasn't until the other missionary suffered myrterdom, that Patrick was sent to Ireland.

On his way to Ireland, he stopped in Gaul and enlisted the help of three Gaulish bishops in his quest. They preached and converted from 432 until 461 when Patrick died.

Even though the Irish diefy St. Patrick much the way the Jews do Moses, he was an Italian who had the aid of three Frenchmen to bring "Irish pagans" to the one true fold. So, when all you Irishmen out there are out celebrating the feast of St. Patrick, stop and toast the Italians who, without which, your patron Saint might have been Jewish.
