

### BASEBALL HAS SLOW START

The Monarch baseball team got off to a shaky start this season, dropping three of the first four games.

"The pitching and defense are pretty good but the hitting has got to come around," explained coach Bill Meyer.

"We've got a young club and we need a couple of wins under our belts to become more confident."

Florida Southern beat Leo's 5-1 at Lakeland in the Feb. 27th opener behind their sophomore ace, Jeff Pryor, who now boasts a 9-0 collegiate record. Fred Cambria, the loser, pitched a fine ball game, allowing only two runs, until the eighth when four Monarch errors resulted in three unearned runs for FSU. A walk and two wild pitches accounted for Leo's lone score in the top of the ninth.

Meyer's squad settled for a split in last Saturday's doubleheader against U.S.F. in Tampa. Ray Korn Zipped a two hit shut out in the opener, picking up where he left off last season when he clinched the finale against Jacksonville on a one-hitter. Larry Sorensen, the 5'8, 150 pound freshman from Mokena, Illinois went three for four (a pair of doubles and a single) in the 3-0 victory.

The coach cited Sorensen (battin.455) as having contributed the most outstanding effort thus far. "He looks good at the plate and in the outfield," Meyer pointed out. The coach is also pleased with Korn's present performance. He too roams the outfield when not pitching.

In the nightcap of last week's twin bill, Cambria and the Monarchs were nipped 4-3 by Marv Scherqer and three other South Florida Hurlers. All the Leo runs were tallied in the first inning and no Monarch reached first on a base hit after the second inning.

Phil Hopkins was the first casualty of the young season, tearing ligaments in his knee last Saturday. Meyer and assistant coach Tim Crosby don't expect him back this year.

Eight Monarch errors and the University of Tampa team spoiled Leo's home debut on Tuesday. Senior Ben Maciocio from Rhode Island suffered the 4-1 loss despite his fine four-hitter.

The next encounter is against Tampa again in an "away" game on Tuesday.
